

CAMPANIA DECLARED RED ZONE

From the 15 of November the Campania Region is a “red zone”.

Within a red zone, any movement is forbidden, both within the same municipality and towards neighboring municipalities with the exception of movements motivated by work needs, situations of necessity (for example purchase of necessary goods) or health reasons.

It is not allowed to visit or meet with relatives or friends who are not cohabiting, in any place, outdoor or indoor.

Movements strictly necessary to attend face-to-face educational activities are permitted.

Return to one's home or residence is allowed.

Without a valid reason to go out, it is mandatory to stay at home, for the good of all.

You always need to demonstrate that the movement fits within the permitted cases, also through a self-declaration that can be made on specific forms, already supplied to the police. False declarations constitute a crime.

At Federico II University all the activities (lectures, exams, laboratories, internships) starting from Monday 16th November 2020 take place remotely.

Individual or small group activities, carried out in safe conditions, can continue to be in presence such as: courses for medical doctor including internships and other activities that are difficult to substitute remotely (e.g. laboratories aimed at the realization of the degree or doctoral thesis, restoration laboratories), any access to libraries/study rooms and all research/internship activities considered mandatory and non postponable.

The University remains open at the moment and research activities are not interrupted. Access to public remains free in compliance with all security measures aimed at limiting the spread of the virus. Nothing changes regarding the use of University services, only by appointment.
